Applicants must

- self-identify as Black persons from Africa or of the African diaspora (e.g., African and Africa-descended people from the Caribbean, North America, Europe or Latin America)
- have demonstrable successful experience in initiating and implementing strategies and policies on anti-Black racism, anti-bias, and anti-oppression in an educational context
- have deep understanding of Black culture, Black people's histories and experiences, scholarship in the area of anti-Black racism, and current equity-related issues experienced by Black people and people from other equity-deserving communities

Additional requirements:

- OCT membership in good standing
- University degree (advanced degree in the courses' subject area an asset)
- Extensive and recent teaching experience in Ontario K-12 schools
- Demonstrated leadership in working with Ontario teachers and curriculum
- Awareness of current trends in educational research
- Willingness to collaborate and to receive feedback
- Strong organizational and time management skills and ability to meet deadlines
- Strong written communication skills
- Proficiency with Microsoft Word
- Familiarity with adult learning, particularly in the online learning environment
- Previous curriculum writing an asset
